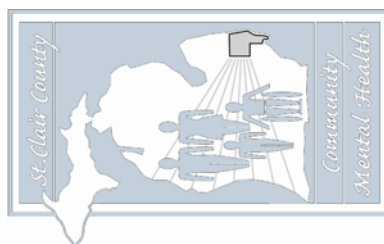

About Our Services...

St. Clair County Community Mental Health Child & Family Services provides support to families with children who have a severe emotional disturbance or developmental disability. A flexible collection of supports and services may help you to keep your family intact, prevent unwanted out-of-home placement, and cope with the stress of a temporary out-of-home placement. Our services could be provided in the following locations: schools, home, work, community, etc.

Services are tailored to each child's specific needs through a Person Centered Planning / Family Centered Practice process. This process includes the child's family, friends and other support people, and is based on your family's specific hopes and desires.

HOME-BASED PROGRAM

The Home-Based Program provides in-home services to children and adolescents ages 4-18 years old who are diagnosed with a severe emotional disturbance and are at risk of out-of-home placement.

CHILDREN'S HOME

The St. Clair County Children's Home, located in Marysville, serves children and adolescents ages 6-18 years old who are in emotional crisis and at significant risk to themselves and/or their family members.

BLUE WATER HOUSE

The Blue Water House, located in Port Huron, is a residential treatment facility for children and adolescents ages 6-18 years old with a cognitive disability and who require extensive behavioral intervention.

INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT PROGRAM

The Intensive Outpatient Program provides outpatient treatment services one or two times per week for children and adolescents ages 4-18 years old and their families.

SCREENING & ASSESSMENT SERVICES

The SAS program is a screening process whereby children and adolescents may be referred for assessment, and may be linked with mental health services.

DAY TREATMENT NIGHT WATCH

The Day Treatment/Night Watch program is a partial day program for adolescents age 12-17 years old who have been court ordered to participate.

FAMILY SUPPORT

The Family Support program provides case management, clinical and mental health assistant support services for families and their children who are diagnosed with a developmental disability.

RESPIRE SERVICES

Respite care provides an occasional break for the parent and/or unpaid caregiver. It's time away from your family member who has special needs.

EARLY ON

Early On is a case management program designed for infants age birth to three years old. Infants receiving care must have an identified medical condition or developmental delay.

SPECIAL PARENTS

The Special Parents program is a home-based service for adults with a developmental disability who are parents or expectant parents.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY / NURSING SUPPORT

OT and nursing support provides assistance to children whose mental health status would improve with these additional supports.
