HIPAA	A recipient of mental health services has the right to have personal information and information about his/her services kept private. This training will provide staff with information about HIPAA privacy and HIPAA security; Confidentiality and informed consent, applying it in appropriate contexts; How to release information legally; When information regarding clients can be discussed and what information cannot be discussed; HIPAA requirements; Mental Health Code requirements.
